Choose a very specific color: not blue but cerulean, not pink but fuscia.

Gather compelling images of your color from books, places, objects, museums, (new) work you make—images can come from anywhere **except** the Internet.

Choose your 6–8 best images. Post them in a carousel to the course Instagram:

Read about your color to supplement your experience. Then, write a caption (at least 200 words) reflecting on what you learned and observed. A few questions to consider:

- \*Why did you pick this color? What about it intrigues you?
- \*How does it interact with other colors?

- \*Did you discover anything surprising about your color?
- \*What does the color communicate to you?

As you are writing your caption, be creative! Tell a story about your experience searching for this color. Also think about how you can contribute something thoughtful and meaningful to Instagram.

Before you post, ask a friend, family member, etc. to review your caption for clarity, spelling, and grammar.
